

Transcript – Zooming In

The comparison chart has four columns. The first column consists of the current TEKS. The document is organized in order of the current TEKS, as these are the content standards until 2015–2016 for high school math courses. The second column has the corresponding revised student expectation, if it exists. The column titled “Supporting Information” contains a brief explanation of the changes and clarifying information. The final column is a place for you to make any personal notes.

In order to help you see the changes that have been made, the document is color-coded. Content that has been moved to a different course or deleted from the TEKS is highlighted in pink. The supporting information column lists where the content has moved.

Content that is remaining or has been clarified is marked in green. Think, “green is good to go.” This section also includes some symbols to help identify the changes. A solid circle indicates the item is staying in the TEKS. A solid circle with a plus sign indicates that clarification has been added for the particular TEKS. A white circle within a shaded circle indicates a deletion. Part of the student expectation may have been moved or deleted.

Content highlighted in blue is new to the course. Think, “blue is new.” You may see student expectations that are shaded in two colors. For example, if the student expectation is partially green and partially blue, the student expectation has a portion that currently exists in the TEKS, but another portion has been added. There is a key at the bottom of the page to assist you.
