

Standard vs. Learning Progression

Standards

A standard is a mandated expectation for students at a specific grade level. They define what students should understand and be able to do in their study of a content area.

Learning Progressions (LPs)

A learning progression is a description of the ways of thinking about a topic that is not grade level specific. It is a pathway in which students may learn a concept.



Standard vs. Learning Progression

Standards	Learning Progressions
Tell teachers what is expected for them to teach and what students should learn	Help to design a diagnostic and support tool for teachers to use to identify learning gaps
Define common content and performance expectations for all students in particular grades	Represent hypotheses about <i>how</i> students' understanding actually <i>develops</i> over many grades
Moving forward, using both standards and learning progressions can help you support your struggling students at a more comprehensive level.
