Outcomes

- Collaboration between the IHE liaison and the principal will be highlighted, and we will show how this collaboration is central to designing systems that result in high performance.

School History and Context

- Spring ISD is a urban school district in the Greater Houston area. We serve a diverse student population with high mobility.
- Established in 2011 after a year of planning, Early College Academy Southridge (ECAS) found a home in our "Educational cottages" where we began with 8 teachers, 1 counselor, 1 administrator, and a nurse. The Spring ISD and Lone Star College had a long and productive relationship prior to ECAS and it has flourished.
- The class of 2015 was the first graduating class and we just graduated our second.



Academic Advising

- Yearly meeting with department chairs to discuss our school, dialog about programming, and gain insight about course expectations
- AVID-graduation/AA credit checks and transcript review
- Weekly college connections (LSC) counselor meets with students to help them plan their AA, enroll in courses, learn how to read their LSC transcript, know how to browse the course catalog
- College connections counselor works with our counselor to provide mandatory information meetings to our parents
- At risk students are mentored every six weeks

- English TSI Prep
- 2 days of team work and school culture at the high school
- 3 days of learning to be a college students at the IHE
- Scholarship ceremony

Staffing

- IHE approves transcript of teachers before we interview.
- Department chairs recommend candidates.
- Liaison sits alongside the principal during interviews.
- The result is our teachers are able to teach the dual credit classes and they are connected to the IHE.
- When the HS needs adjuncts, we ask our liaison and she gets a few potentials for us. We interview the adjuncts and decide on who is the best fit. In addition, we dialog with the IHE and select our adjuncts.
